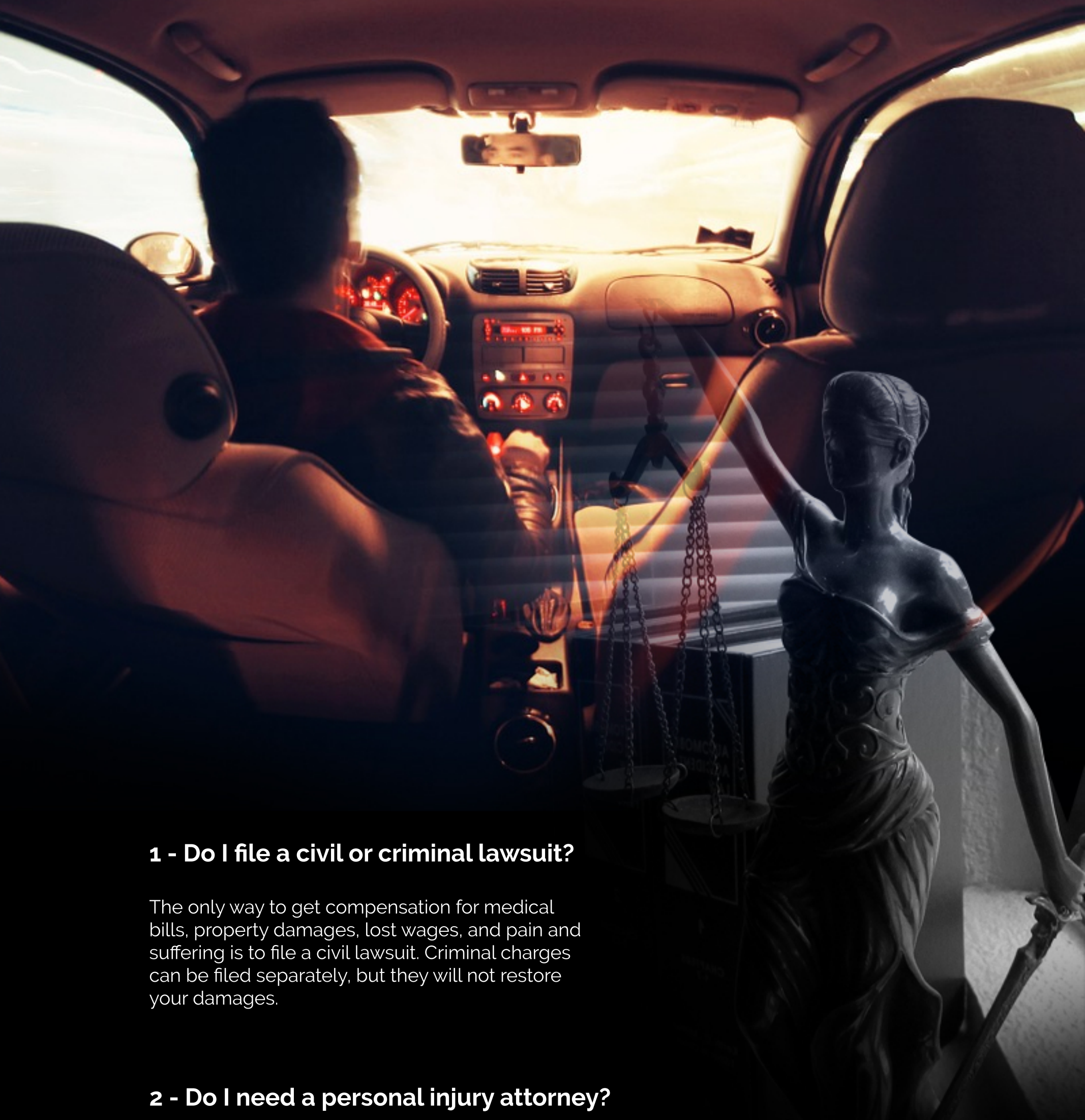


4 Questions to Ask Yourself After Being Hit by a Drunk Driver



1 - Do I file a civil or criminal lawsuit?

The only way to get compensation for medical bills, property damages, lost wages, and pain and suffering is to file a civil lawsuit. Criminal charges can be filed separately, but they will not restore your damages.
